Message from the President

When we write out the name of our club—Soroptimist International of Sequim—we mostly think about the Sequim part: the scholarships, Live Your Dream Award, the Medical Loan Closet, and committed funds. But at this time, the concept of being part of an International organization is more than important, it is crucial.

As of 28th March 2022, more than 2,300,000 refugees from Ukraine have entered **Poland**, and every day more and more women and children in need of help are arriving.

Around us people have been listening to the news and wondering what they could do to help. We took action as a club, and by taking action we inspired others in our area to do so. Our first round of donations added \$20,100 to the \$10,000 the club had committed. Even after we sent off \$30,100 people kept contacting us to see if they could contribute. So a second round of donations totaling \$12,730 has gone out.

When there is a crisis and someone wants to help, it's tough to pick just the organization that will get the money to the people who need it. And everyone has to be careful not to fall victim to a scam—especially since it seems like the Russians are likely to be the ones doing the scamming.

Because we belong to an international organization, we are fortunate to be able to send our money directly to people we know will help. We sent the funds to a Soroptimist International club in Poland, a country which is absorbing so many of the refugees. By sending it to SI/Poland, we know that it will be watched over and used carefully. Their plan includes:

the purchase of food and other essential items such as hygiene products,

help in finding accommodation,

help with access to psychological assistance,

help with access to legal assistance,

help with access to interpreters and translators.

Their goal is to help as many people as possible and every Soroptimist Club in Poland has plans in place for assistance to support the refugees, mainly women and children.

It's good to remember that we do things like the Garden Show and Auction to raise money so we can help more than Sequim, we do them so we can help women and girls wherever there is a need.

Letter from the Editor

Dear Friends,

It's April, the month with the reputation for having showers—though it is not the only month with rain.

Case in point A couple of weeks ago—before April made an appearance—Blue and I encountered some precipitation while on our morning walk. It couldn't be snow because the temperature wasn't cold enough. It didn't look like rain because it wasn't drops. It wasn't sleet—again, not cold enough. As Blue pulled on the leash I looked to the side and noticed foliage moving. Ah, wind. The precipitation was indeed rain, but the wind was blowing, making it streak across my field of view. I had been looking straight ahead and didn't see what was in the periphery. Sometimes we don't notice something until our attention is drawn to it.

One example of this is relative to the money we sent to SI of Poland to assist the Ukrainian refugees. As President Cat states in her article on page 1, our first round of donations was \$30,100. A press release about it was sent to the Sequim Gazette and an article was published. The following Monday one of our members was dropping something off at the Sequim Food Bank. The president of the local Rotary was volunteering that day and commented about the article in the newspaper. Our member asked him what his organization was doing for the Ukrainians. He said a lot of communication about that had been circulating via email and they decided to send Shelter Boxes. Our action spurred others to take action.

Our first round of donations was sent within a few days of our decision to do it. More people wanted to donate. Treasurer Shelle Paulbitski came up with the idea of a 10 x 10 campaign—members would contact 10 family/friends and invite them to donate \$10. The deadline was set to be about two weeks out. If 30 of our members participated, the amount collected would be \$3,000. Most folks would be willing to donate \$10, and some would donate a little more. The second round resulted in \$12,730.00.

The campaign offered people the opportunity to be part of something bigger than themselves. It doesn't matter if they gave \$10 or \$100. Each donation came from the same place—the desire to help in time of need. I am grateful to our members, their families/friends and our community. We are showering the Ukrainians with our caring and funds for necessities.

More showering April showers bring May flowers. Our Virtual Garden Show will begin blooming with webinars April 23 and April 30, followed by our Online Auction April 27-May 1. See pages 2-3 for details, including links to register for the webinars. The funds brought in from the auction will allow us to continue showering others with scholarships, Live Your Dream Awards, donations for those in need.

I was thinking of the showers on that morning walk with Blue, and of course Soroptimist came to mind. Some of our members are so quick at what they do, we might not even notice. Some work behind the scenes. To all of those members, I say thank you.

I was thinking about the 10 x 10 campaign. Each donation, on its own, would do little. However, putting all those donations together created something with a definite impact. It's like that with our members. Each of us is important to the whole. Each of us, participating at whatever level we can, produces the greatest results. Our collective impact is seen even in the periphery. We will continue to work in unity as we move through A Brand New Normal.


MEDICAL LOAN CLOSET

We received **142** calls during the month of March. We loaned **58** items, had **63** items returned, and received **\$1,170** in donations.

IMPROVING LIVES THROUGH OUR COMMITTED FUNDS Focus on Dungeness Valley Health & Wellness Clinic a.k.a. Sequim Free Clinic

Dungeness Valley Health & Wellness Clinic (DVHWC) was started back in 2001. Mary Griffith, R.N. is credited with the start of the clinic. She had received numerous calls from retired individuals who were too young to qualify for Medicare and could not afford to pay for health care.



Out of one person's vision and a lot of help from donors, community partners, and foundations, DVHWC has grown over the years. It currently serves those in our community who do not have health insurance, or those who have insurance but can't afford their deductibles or copays as well as those who haven't yet found a primary care provider in the area.

Today, DVHWC is more commonly referred to as the Sequim Free Clinic. Since 2001, Intake statistics continue to show that:

69% of their patients are under the age of 50;

84% have no doctor;

78% have no health insurance; and

45% are employed.

In 2020, after initial treatment:

109 patients were referred for diagnostic labs; and

58 patients received vouchers and were referred to local dentists for emergency dental services.

Our first monetary donation to DVHWC was in 2016 in support of their Fun Walk. We also encouraged our members to sign up for and participate in the fun walk. Participants were invited to bring their four-legged friends, keeping them on a leash, of course. I don't know how many joined in the walk, but I do recall there were quite a few from our club participating.

Since then, we have included them in our Committed Funds Recipient list every year. As reflected in their tagline, they are A Beacon of Health, A Beacon of Hope.
