Message from the President

The theme I chose for this year is A Brand New Normal.

We all want to go back to "normal," but this past year has made us realize how ephemeral that term is. The dramatic upheavals we experienced in health, politics, and the social order have meant re-thinking our histories and our expectations. It's never going to be the same normal it was, and we will have to find what the new normal entails.

SIA studies discovered that, "When clubs and members are asked what they want most, they say—more members and greater recognition. The only way to accomplish this is by having a strong brand...That means <u>all</u> SIA clubs should implement our brand-unifying Dream Programs, which economically empower women and girls who face obstacles."

So I added "Brand" to "A New Normal" and came up with A Brand New Normal! The goal is that by next June everyone in town will have heard the words "Live Your Dream," and will know they connect to Soroptimist International of Sequim.

What does that mean for the coming year? More outreach, especially through our committed funds recipients, to find the women and girls who are candidates for the *Live Your Dream* award. Developing a *Dream It*, *Be It* program for younger girls. We need to strengthen these elements in Sequim during the next year, and join Soroptimists all over the world who are focusing on helping women and girls, especially those facing obstacles, to achieve economic empowerment and live their dreams.

And economic empowerment doesn't end with finding a job; many women in Sequim need to understand and be able to cope with finances when they suddenly become single, through death or divorce. Our Tea with SHE program has done an excellent job beginning this type of support, and I hope we will be able to build on this in new and innovative ways.

The term Live Your Dream starts with Living—and that's where our Medical Loan Closet comes in. Sequim has an older population, and our Medical Loan Closet support to the community is incredibly valuable here and will continue to be.

This coming year has two excellent opportunities for expanding our brand in the community—the SIA 100th anniversary and our own club's 75th anniversary. We will be looking for exciting and fun ways to publicize the Live Your Dream slogan, to connect with women and girls, and to be a vital part of creating A Brand New Normal here.

Letter from the Editor

Dear Friends,

It's July, the beginning of a new Soroptimist year. President Cat's theme is **A Brand New Normal**. This seems so fitting after our year of thinking Outside the Box (but seemingly working inside the box, i.e., the computer screen).

In her acceptance speech at installation, President Cat presented us with a poll. It consisted of a list of dreams—one from each of the board members. We were asked to guess which dream belonged to which board member. A few were easy, but a few were difficult and surprisingly unexpected. I thought this was a great way of introducing her vision—it made all of us think.

Have I had a dream? I started contemplating this. . . I think I had a dream—but I didn't realize it was a dream until after it was achieved. The dream was to become a published author, and it happened when I was 17. Some of my poems were published in a magazine. I wasn't astute enough back then to keep a copy of the publication.

I believe that experience helped shape my future. Writing is an important element of my life—it is like a part of my DNA. I am fortunate to have the privilege of writing an article every month for our club newsletter. I am ever grateful for that opportunity. So, in a way, I am still living that dream. Writing is branded into me; it is my normal. As a club we are embarking on a new year with A Brand New Normal.

A Brand New Normal is more than a group of words. It is more than a wish for better times. It is a call to action—a call to make the Dream Programs more integrated into our lives. It is a call to educate the public and to have Live Your Dream be more recognized by the community.

The way to start is to educate our members and to present a united, consistent message. That is part of branding. You might ask why branding is important. Let's take a look at one example.

What comes to mind when someone mentions facial tissue? Most likely it is Kleenex. There are other facial tissues available, but Kimberly-Clark did such a great job of marketing Kleenex, it is branded into our brains. Today we often refer to Kleenex even when we are actually buying Puffs, Scotties or even a generic tissue. This did not happen overnight. It happened over time because of their consistency of message.

I was thinking about the word **consistency**. One definition is: "conformity in the application of something." But consistency has another meaning: "the way in which a substance, typically liquid, holds together; thickness or viscosity."

Our members are a bit like the second definition above. We are the substance that holds our club together. Like liquid, we are fluid; what each member gives sometimes changes depending on what is happening in her/his life. But in the end the consistency of the whole remains intact.

We will probably continue to think Outside the Box, even as we move forward together, shaping A Brand New Normal.

MEDICAL LOAN CLOSET

We are excited to announce that we currently have **13** SIS members on the MLC Team! Team members include Melody Albertson, Becky Archer (Co-Chair), Marti Campbell, Susan Coffee, Judy Field, Paulette Hill, Shirley Legg, Jane Manzer, Linda Naylor, Janet Popelka, Elaine Powlesland, Jolene Sanborn, and Chris Snow (Co-Chair). This brings us back to pre-pandemic support and allows us to return to a quarterly rotation for our volunteers (one week per quarter to volunteer at the MLC).



Full MLC staffing is perfect timing as our client calls and equipment loans are approaching pre-pandemic volume. We loaned **94** pieces of equipment, received **47** pieces of equipment, and answered **146** calls in June. Pre-pandemic monthly average was **108** loans, **77** returns and **184** calls. The generous Sequim community donated \$370 in June.

We will continue to operate the Closet throughout the summer and are looking forward to seeing everyone in the fall.

WOMEN FOR WOMEN INTERNATIONAL

Our club recently received a thank you for our support from Women for Women International (WFWI). Here are the impacts listed:

- WFWI reached 23,653 women, providing life-changing training and resources
- Women's DAILY earnings went from an average of \$0.80 at enrollment in the program to \$2.00 upon graduation. Their savings also grew from an average of \$13 to \$88.
- The number of women who reported practicing family planning more than doubled.
- Upon graduation, 79% more women reported being involved in household decisions about having more children, and 56% more reported being involved in financial decisions.

Along with the report on the impacts of our support, I also noted that Women for Women International received the Conrad N. Hilton Humanitarian Prize, which is presented annually to an organization that "significantly alleviates human suffering". Even more notable, WFWI is the first women's organization recognized with this honor!

In the Spring 2021 publication by Women for Women International, *Outreach*, there was a celebration of the organization's impacts in Rwanda, where they have served women survivors of war since 1997. Twenty-six years after the genocide, Rwanda has found stability and peace. And unlike the other countries where Women for Women International serves, Rwanda has a robust government that actively invests in marginalized and forgotten women. Women for Women International believes "that a major force behind Rwanda's recovery is Rwandan women." In addition, WFWI's program is becoming an affiliate NGO, which means that they've gone from conflict-response to supporting long-term development and stability for all women and girls during times of peace.

I, for one, am proud our club's history of sponsoring women through Women for Women International. In the 2021-22 budget year, we will be sponsoring two women. Currently we support a woman in Nigeria, but WFWI also operates in Afghanistan, Democratic Republic of Congo, Iraq, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Rwanda, and South Sudan.

Dear Soroptimist Sisters and Brothers,

I am just finishing a 12-day trip to Chiapas, and it's been so rewarding. (Plus I am missing most of the extreme heat in the Pacific Northwest!) I've had good talks with scholarship recipients, both current and former, and am happy to report that they are excellent role models, inspiring other girls and showing boys that women can shine in leadership positions.

Our children's programs are running well, and I visited one of them. There were 11 children and three scholarship girls teaching, so each child was getting help at the level she/he needed. Whether I was taking girls to the optometrist, buying laptops, or meeting with our coordinator, every day provided me with more reasons to be grateful for those who support the work we are doing to educate indigenous girls. They are grateful (and never fail to tell me this) and so are we.









